

You can create a VUE Map (Virtual Understanding Environment) from images available in the Farm Security Administration - Office of War Information Color Photographs Collection and Black-and-White Negatives Collection at the Library of Congress, as well as other sources, such as the NYPL Digital Collections. VUE is open-source software developed by Tufts University, http://vue.tufts.edu/. As a class project, develop maps of various events and music during the civil rights movement of the 1950s and 1960s. Advanced students should visit the local library or

town historical society to find images.
